IN ALL EMERGENCIES

Emergency Response

When a student:
— is a victim of an attack
— appears to pose imminent danger to the safety of him/her self or others

Open
24 hours/7 days per week

Resolution

An officer will be dispatched to the scene, a threat assessment made and the response will be based on the situation, including medical help, if needed.

FOR NON-EMERGENCY CONCERNS

Mental Health Consultation

When student exhibits:
— severe anxiety,
— depression,
— suicidal thoughts or
— other intense emotional disturbances

if no
immediate harm
seems likely

UPD to consult with Crisis Services and/or require an involuntary evaluation under Mental Hygiene Law (Section 9.41)

Appointments are made with students for assessment and treatment. Urgent cases will be assisted immediately. Services are free. Faculty or staff making a referral are asked to notify the Counseling Center.

Trained counselors will assess the situation to provide counseling, hospitalization or other appropriate intervention.

Conduct/Disruptive Behavior

When student behavior is inappropriate or disruptive to a class, a residence hall or any other campus location

The Dean of Students will advise the student of consequences they face if disruptive behavior continues. If warranted, a judicial complaint will be requested to initiate a formal disciplinary review. Faculty or staff making a referral are asked to notify the Dean of Students.

Other/Not Sure

Call your department chair, associate dean, immediate supervisor, the dean of students, or University Police

The situation will be assessed and either resolved directly or by appropriate referral. Associate deans or supervisors should be notified.
