The Countdown to Commencement is On!



Ceremony registration and ticket distribution for Buffalo State College's 150th Commencement ceremony started on April 14 and runs through May 20. Families of graduating seniors, please encourage your graduate to plan ahead to register and to purchase caps and gowns. Commencement will be held on Saturday, May 21 in the Buffalo State Sports Arena.

Commencement Planning

As you begin planning for commencement, please review the Families section of the commencement website to find ceremony times and durations, the academic school degree listings to determine which ceremony your graduate is attending, gift suggestions for your graduate, directions to campus, and more. Also review the Bachelor's Ceremonies Viewing Options for helpful information about guest tickets and options for guests without tickets. Please know, all guests entering the Sports Arena, including babies and small children, require a guest ticket for entry. A comfortable, air-conditioned alternative with live stream viewing is provided in the Campbell Student Union Social Hall for guests without tickets. Tickets are not required for the receptions following each ceremony.

Commencement Photos

A professional photographer will take photos of each graduate on commencement day as they cross the stage and will provide access to the photos for purchase following commencement. Guests are not allowed to approach the stage during the ceremony.

Prior to commencement day, families are welcome to join their grads in attending the Cross the Stage event from May 9 to May 11 to take pre-commencement photos. This event does not replace the commencement ceremony, but is a fun opportunity for graduates, friends, and family to take your own photos on a decorated portable stage with your graduate in their cap and gown!

Residence Life Policies for Finals Week, Spring Semester Move Out, and Summer Housing Options



Finals Week Policies

Leading up to finals week, a 24-hour quiet hour policy and "no guest" policy will take effect in all residence halls beginning Sunday, May 8 at 10:00 p.m., and will remain in effect until all buildings officially close on Saturday, May 21 at 12:00 p.m. All residential students must move out of their residence halls 24 hours after their final examination.

Spring Semester Move Out

When students are ready to move out of their residence hall at the end of the spring semester, they will need to empty their room and common areas of all belongings. Any belongings that are left behind after students check out will be considered abandoned property and will be discarded by Residence Life staff. Please note if students leave behind trash or significant abandoned property, it may result in additional charges to their student account. Prior to and after a student checks out of their room, Residence Life staff will conduct a room inspection. Any damages to the space or furniture may result in damage billing to that student, or to all students, in an assigned suite or apartment. After students empty their room and common areas, they will return any assigned keys, key cards, or key fobs issued by Residence Life to their building desk. Check out will be conducted by Residence Life staff, or through the building Express Check Out system if staff are not present. Summer Housing Options

Residence Life offers summer housing options for students who are enrolled in Buffalo State Summer Sessions. To be eligible for summer housing, students must be enrolled in the Early Summer Session (May 31 - July 1), Late Summer Session (July 11 - August 12), or the entire Variable Summer Session (May 31 - August 12). Summer housing for students will be offered in the Student Apartment Complex at a rate of \$60 per night. Please note students will not be eligible to remain in their current housing assignment for any of the summer sessions. If students are enrolled in the Early Summer Session or the entire Variable Summer Session, they will be able to move directly into their summer housing assignment on May 20. If students are living on campus in the Fall and they are enrolled in the Late Summer Session or the entire Variable Summer Session, they may be eligible to move directly into their Fall housing assignment on August 13.

To request summer housing, please advise students to submit a Summer Housing Request. Students will be required to provide proof of registration for summer sessions when submitting the request. Students can access Buffalo State's online job board BengalLink to find part-time, full-time, summer, and internship opportunities. Openings are posted from employers in the Western New York region and across the country, and organizations include corporations, government agencies, and non-profits such as cultural organizations and human services agencies.



Within BengalLink, students can also access and search CareerShift, a job and internship resource that lists thousands of jobs and internships, including opportunities for remote work.

Students Can Apply for the Frederick and Marilyn Howe Community Engagement Scholarship



Please let students know the Frederick and Marilyn Howe Community Engagement Scholarship is now accepting applications until June 13. This opportunity provides up to a four-year scholarship to a student from Western New York who has done significant volunteer work to address community and social issues and who will commit to continuing to volunteer as a college student. Incoming freshmen and students who will have sophomore status in fall 2022 and who will be enrolled full time at Buffalo State may be eligible to apply for the Frederick and Marilyn Howe Community Engagement Scholarship.

Full student eligibility requirements include the following:

- Freshman or sophomore status in fall 2022.
- Enrolled full time at Buffalo State.
- Resident graduate of a Western New York high school.
- Grade point average (GPA) of 85 percent in high school and 2.5 in college.
- Community service or leadership experience.
- Completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Tell Students: Sign Up for Buff State Alert to Receive Campus Emergency Notifications



Buff State Alert is the campus emergency notification system. Students, faculty, and staff members who wish to enroll in Buff State Alert or modify their contact information in the system may do so by visiting the Buff State Alert website and logging in with their Buffalo State user name and password. Anyone who does not have a Buffalo State username or password can still sign up for text messages only from Buff State Alert by texting the word "buffalostate" to 79516.

Buff State Alert is used to convey messages regarding serious campus safety issues, utility failures, or weather-related campus wide closures and cancellations. Buff State Alert is capable of sending text messages, recorded voice messages, and email messages to multiple addresses and phone numbers. Additionally, the system is capable of immediately posting messages to the Buffalo State home page, social media sites, the campus cable system, and select video message boards.

Personal data provided to Buff State Alert will not be used for any other purpose or for campus information broadcast. Ishmael Hargrove, President's Medal Award Nominee



Ishmael Hargrove earned both his Master's Degree and Graduate Certificate in Adult Education at Buffalo State College. Ishmael was nominated as a finalist for the President's Medal Award, the highest honor awarded to a Buffalo State student. Ishmael performed extensive independent research on sports nutrition and its impact on athletic performance and overall health. From this research, he presented several sports nutrition seminars to multiple Buffalo State teams during his time as a graduate student. Ishmael also demonstrated relentless efforts to spread fairness and equality among those he worked with, leading to him receive the Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion Scholarship from the National Strength & Conditioning Association.

Cody Crist, SUNY Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence Nominee



Cody Crist is a U.S. Army veteran and non-traditional student at Buffalo State College and is a member of the Muriel A. Howard Honors program. Cody was nominated for the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence, the highest honor awarded to a student within the State University of New York system. Cody is a diligent researcher, worked as an undergraduate student teaching assistant, and earned an Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship in Geology. Cody also conducted research on behalf of the college's Whitworth Ferguson Planetarium and serves as president of the college's Astronomy/Geology Club. Beyond campus, Cody has volunteered to train disabled and amputee veterans in rock climbing and mental health exercises and is also a volunteer firefighter at UCREST Fire Department.

R.A.D. Women's Basic Self-Defense Classes



Buffalo State College students, faculty, and staff are invited to participate in the R.A.D. Aggression Defense course, a four-week program of realistic self-defense tactics and techniques that begins on Wednesday, April 20, and continues each Wednesday through May 11 from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. in Buckham Hall A114.

The R.A.D. System is a comprehensive course for women that begins with awareness, prevention, risk reduction, and avoidance, while progressing on to the basics of hands-on defense training. R.A.D. is not a martial arts program. Courses are taught by certified R.A.D. instructors and provide participants with a workbook and reference manual that outlines the entire physical defense program for reference and continuous personal growth. The 12-hour R.A.D. program is conducted in four sessions, and participants must attend all sessions.
