Free Tax-Prep Sessions Offered for Eligible Individuals from February to April 2022



In partnership with the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance, Buffalo State College will offer free facilitated self-assisted tax return preparation sessions for eligible individuals including students, alumni, community members, faculty, and staff from February to April 2022. This opportunity allows you to complete and file your New York State and federal taxes with the support of volunteers. Department of Taxation and Finance staff members will provide an overview of the computer software via video conference, and you'll have a 90-minute to two-hour video session to complete your filing. Registration is required in advance. Video conference sessions are available at 8:30 a.m. or 12:30 p.m. on February 18 or 25; March 4, 11, 18, or 25; or April 1, 8, or 15. If you do not have the ability to video conference, please register for an on-campus session between March 4 and April 15 to access a reserved computer lab space. Tell Students: Get Ready to Sign Up for Fall 2022 Housing!



It's almost time for students to sign up for residential housing for the fall 2022 semester! The housing license and dining application for the 2022-2023 academic year will soon be available for students to complete and select their room. Students will be notified of the following information:

- Students will receive a message to their Buffalo State email with specific instructions on how to complete the housing license and dining application. It will be available in their myHousing account under the student tab in Banner.
- **Important note:** the housing license and dining application is a legally binding document, so students should not complete it as a backup.

- A reminder about the housing requirement:
 All full-time first year and second year students whose permanent residence is beyond a 35-mile radius of the college are required to reside on campus FOR 4 CONSECUTIVE SEMESTERS OR UNTIL 60 CREDITS HAVE BEEN EARNED AT BUFFALO STATE, whichever comes first. Pre-college credits, advanced placement credits, CLEP credits, and the like are not considered. Exemptions from this requirement include: married students, single parents, veterans, students over the age of 21, and students commuting from the home of their parent(s) or court appointed guardian(s) if within a 35-mile radius of the Residence Life Office, License Terms and Conditions last updated 10/2019 Page 6 of 25 college. The home address must be the address listed on the college application. Living with a family member that is not a parent or legally appointed guardian does not meet the requirements to live off campus. Additionally, students cannot change their address to that of local housing entity and provide that as proof without two forms of proof (i.e. utility bill, medical bill, current paystub) indicating it is a permanent residence.
- There is a non-refundable \$125 application fee to complete the license. This amount is not in addition to the housing costs, it will be taken off of students' total cost for the fall semester.
- Review the residential housing costs for the 2022-2023 academic year.
- After completing the license, students will receive instructions on how to participate in roommate selection and room selection, which will occur in March 2022.

May 2022 Graduation Application Deadline



Please remind seniors who are expecting to graduate (earn their degree) in May 2022 that the deadline to submit their online graduation application is 11:59 p.m. on February 27. Students who miss the deadline to apply online should contact the Registrar's Office at regofc@buffalostate.edu to request late consideration for graduation. Late applicants may experience a delay in the awarding of their degrees.

Please note: the current online graduation application is for the awarding of a May 2022 degree. Any premature applications will be withdrawn after the application window closes. The application for August 2022 degree candidates will become available on April 18.

The minimum number of credit hours for an undergraduate degree is 120. Students should review their Degree Works audit to make sure all requirements are being met before applying.

Travel Preparation Tips

If your student is planning to travel for spring break, advise them to follow these preparation tips, if applicable:

- Verify your passport is up to date. A U.S. Passport can technically be denied for travel to some countries if you plan on traveling within 6 months before the printed expiration date. For more information, read #17 on travel.state.gov. Please note: in 2022, passport processing is estimated to be 8-11 weeks (routine) and 5-7 weeks (expedited).
- Download the NYS Excelsior Plus App to provide your COVID-19 vaccine card any test results.
- Ensure you are up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines and boosters. Note that some countries require additional specific vaccines.
- Review Buffalo State's COVID-19 Toolkit for help navigating COVID-19 policies and safety tips.
- Research COVID-19 protocols, contactless pay options, and safety locations for where you are traveling. Review COVID-19 safety tips for travelers on the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) website.
- Notify your bank that you will be traveling.
- Carry phone numbers, a credit or debit card, and some cash. Note some locations may be cashless.
- Update the emergency contacts or settings in your phone in case it is lost or stolen, or in case someone needs to connect with your emergency contacts.
- Ensure you have enough medication to last you a few extra days in case there are any travel delays or emergencies. If necessary, you may be able to request for your pharmacy to contact your insurance company to fill your prescription early.
- When making travel accommodations, consider avoiding making reservations on the first floor of an Airbnb or hotel as they can be more prone to theft.

Travel Safety Tips

If your student is traveling for spring break, advise them to follow these safety tips during their travel:

- Be aware of your surroundings.
- Drink responsibly, stay with your friends, and make a plan in case you are separated.
- Protect your location on social media sites but consider sharing your location with loved ones.
- Be mindful of traveling and cyber scams
- Wear sunscreen and stay hydrated but be cautious about drinking tap water.
- Have fun, relax, and enjoy yourself responsibly!

Campus Mask Mandate Remains in Effect at Buffalo State



Although the indoor mask requirement has been lifted for private businesses across New York State, the indoor mask requirement at Buffalo State College remains in effect until further notice. All members of our campus community, including visitors, are reminded that, regardless of vaccination status, close-fitting face masks are required to be worn in all indoor spaces on campus. The only exceptions to the indoor mask mandate are when faculty or staff members are alone in their personal offices, when students are inside their private residence hall rooms, or when someone is actively eating or drinking in a campus dining area.
